### KANGAROO MILK CHURN



Butter churns have been around for many hundreds of years, in various styles and sizes, from domestic to industrial scale in butter factories. This clever Australian example, the 'Tamworth Kangaroo Minute Butter Churn' was for small-scale use and adaptable to almost any size container that could be clamped into it.

It was made by H. H. Hinds in Sydney, probably in the 1930's, and is constructed of timber, steel and cast-iron. It is claimed to be able to make butter in one minute.

There are many more butter churns on display with it in the Dairy Display at the Historical and Mining Museum.
