SUGAR SCUTTLE



During and after World War 1 some of the troops and prisoners of war built mementos from bits and pieces of war material.

This sugar scuttle made by Corporal Henry Ernest Sullivan is a good example of the trench art of the time. He served with the Fifth Light Horse Regiment in Romani, Egypt in 1916.

It is constructed from part of a Turkish rifle but, some bullets, a British time fuse, and portion of an 18 pounder shell case.
